COUNCIL CHAPLAIN

My Brother Knights,

Below are some excerpts from Pope Francis' Ash Wednesday of Feb. 14, 2018. Our Holy Father reminds us that Lent is a good time - a favorable time - to rid our lives of the dissonant chords of Christian life by recognizing the temptations that we are subject to and how they can lead to distrust, apathy and resignation in our life and how these demons deaden and paralyze our souls. The antidote for that Pope Francis says is to take time this Lent to pause, see and return. Indeed let us pause from our regular routines to see Love in the Crucified Christ and to see that Love in each other. Let us return without fear to our God who never tires of forgiving us and who longs to touch our hearts so as to rekindle them with his love and mercy. Here are excerpts from Pope Francis's Ash Wednesday Homily.

“The Church in her maternal wisdom invites us to pay special attention to anything that could dampen or even corrode our believing heart. We are subject to numerous temptations. Each of us knows the difficulties we have to face. When faced with the ever-varying circumstances of our daily lives, there are voices raised that take advantage of pain and uncertainty; the only thing they aim to do is sow distrust. . . . [T]he fruit of distrust is apathy and resignation.

Lent is the ideal time to unmask these and other temptations, to allow our hearts to beat once more in tune with the vibrant heart of Jesus. The whole of the Lenten season is imbued with this conviction, which we could say is echoed by three words offered to us in order to rekindle the heart of the believer: pause, see and return.

Pause a little, leave behind the unrest and commotion that fill the soul with bitter feelings which never get us anywhere. Pause from this compulsion to a fast-paced life that scatters, divides and ultimately destroys time with family, friends, children, grandparents, . . . time with God. Pause for a little while, refrain from haughty looks, from fleeting and pejorative comments. Pause in order to look and contemplate!

See the face of our families who continue striving, day by day, with great effort, in order to move forward in life. . . . See the faces of our children and young people filled with yearning for the future and hope, filled with “tomorrows” and opportunities that demand dedication and protection. See our elderly whose faces are marked by the passage of time, faces that reveal the living memory of our people. See the faces of our sick people and the many who take care of them; faces which in their vulnerability and service remind us the value of each person.

See and contemplate the face of Crucified Love, [whose] hand [is] held out to those who feel crucified, who experience in their lives the burden of failure, disappointment and heartbreak. . . . See and contemplate the real face of Christ crucified out of love for everyone, without exception. For everyone? Yes, for everyone.

Pause, see and return. Return to the house of your Father. Return without fear to those outstretched, eager arms of your Father, who is rich in mercy (cf. Eph 2:4), who awaits you. Return without fear, for this is the favorable time to come home, to the home of my Father and your Father (cf. Jn 20:17). Return without fear, to experience the healing and reconciling tenderness of God.”

Dear Brother Knights, time passes quickly. How well have you used this time of Lent? This is indeed a favorable time to pause, see and return. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a great grace to help us return to God so I encourage you to make use of this great gift. Christ's love and mercy knows no bounds. So whether it has been a few weeks, a few months, a few years, or a few decades now is the acceptable time, now is the time to accept the Lord's invitation to be reconciled. St. Stanislaus Basilica, each Advent and Lent, hosts a special evening to receive the Sacrament for all of the Chicopee parishes. This Lent that evening is Wednesday, March 21. About 15 priests will be available beginning at 7 p.m. for as long as it takes to offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation not only in English, but also Polish, French, Italian, and Spanish. Take the time this Lent to pause, see and return!
